2023 PROCESS: SURVEY RESULTS AND PRIORITIES

Priorities presented in June 2023

- A. Focus the PNMA work on **project implementation lessons and policy/regulatory conditions** that supported the achievements previously collated, on a multisectoral approach and under the lens of intersectionality, scalability, and localisation.
- B. **Actively promote the good practices** that have been identified by the Policy Network in the 3 focus areas across all the stakeholder groups and through the Digital Cooperation initiative. The **network of the Leadership Panel** could be tested at this occasion; the assistance of the IGF Secretariat in order to establish a direct line of communication with the LP is absolutely indispensable.
- C. Under the guidance and assistance of the IGF Secretariat, open a **permanent dialogue between the PNMA community and institutional partners** (such as the EU, the AU, and the OAS), in order to involve them directly in the PNMA activities and to encourage projects' replication and adaptation in other countries or regions, with active participation of local actors.
- D. **Promote examples of said regional initiatives** (e.g, starting in Africa) to improve awareness about meaningful access and the policies that could support such practice (as indicated in the PNMA 2022 final output and main session reports from Addis Ababa).
- E. **Bring all the achievements and solutions identified through the PNMA activities into the future Digital Compact Initiative**, and effectively contribute to the roadmap leading to the Summit of the Future 2024 and the WSIS+20 and IGF+20 processes.
- F. **Keep the repository of the identified successful practices functional** over time, to create a reference point for all activities in the field of meaningful access.
- G. **Amplify the voices of least advantaged groups** in the public debate on meaningful access (Youth, NRIs, Women, LGBTQIA+, Indigenous, People with Disabilities).
- H. **Monitor implementation of the processes previously identified** as benchmarks and good practices in their region of origin and, eventually, in other regions inspired by the same process.

The priorities below were collected at the end of the 2022 PNMA Process and are included in the final output report. They summarise key issues and considerations around meaningful access that should be promptly addressed, according to the Network. The premises for the PNMA objectives are equally shared between the "access issues" and the "local contents and languages issues" that jointly repr...f priority for the 2023 PNMA Process, with 1 being the most appropriate/urgent action and 8 being the least appropriate/urgent action:

Priority 1: A, B, E, H combined (5 votes, 5 votes, 4 votes, 4 votes)

The **network of the Leadership Panel** could be tested at this occasion; the assistance of the IGF Secretariat in order to establish a direct line of communication with the LP is absolutely indispensable.

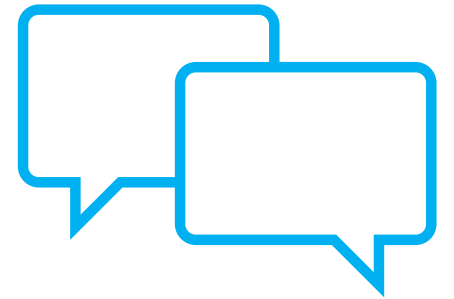

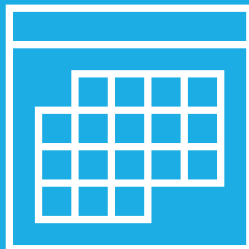
Based on the methodology, a few outputs are expected at the end of the 2023 process; these are listed below as end results from the selected priorities.
