Meeting V | 12 September 2024 at 12:00-13:15 UTC

SUMMARY REPORT

Action items:

- Sub-groups will finalize draft Discussion Papers by 1.10.
- Everyone will share speaker ideas for PNAI's session at IGF 2024 Annual meeting by 10.10.
- Written feedback to UNESCO Consultation paper on AI regulation is welcome through UNESCO website until 19.9.
- The next PNAI MWG calls will take place on 10.10. and 22.10. Registration will open shortly.
- The remaining PNAI MWG 2024 calls are planned for 21.11. and 6.12.

1. The fifth online meeting in 2024 of the Policy Network on Artificial Intelligence (PNAI) Multistakeholder Working Group (MWG) took place on 12 September 2024 at 12:00 UTC.
2. The meeting was hosted by the MAG appointed facilitator of the PNAI and the IGF Secretariat's PNAI Consultant. The final version of the Agenda is attached to this document as Annex A1 and a list of meeting participants as Annex A2. The list of shared documents is annexed as A3.
3. The hosts opened the meeting and explained the agenda. The first goal for the meeting was to give feedback to UNESCO Consultation paper on AI regulation that has been developed in cooperation with the Inter-Parliamentary Union and the IGF's Parliamentary track. Another main item are the final progress updates from the four PNAI Sub-groups.
4. Prateek Sibal and Mei Jie Chen from UNESCO presented highlights of the Consultation paper. The paper was shared to attendees in advance and is attached to this Summary Report.
 - Nine approaches to regulating AI were identified, ranging from principles-based approach to assigning liability to problematic AI uses. Most regulations combine approaches. There is significant progress in regulating AI: between 2016-2023, 32 countries passed laws mentioning AI.
 - Meeting attendees were active in giving feedback through an interactive tool as well as direct questions and comments to the presenters. Suggestions included for example: adding scenarios and to help identify suitable approach for different jurisdictions; the global cooperation between approaches, and, importance of capacity building for policymakers.



- Further feedback is welcome through UNESCO website until 19.9. and Yik Chan is collecting PNAI's written feedback through GoogleDocs.
5. Tuesday **1.10.** is deadline for draft versions of the Discussion Papers.
- Draft Discussion Papers will be debated in the next two PNAI MWG meetings: Thursday **10.10.** and Tuesday **22.10.** Two topics per call. Attendees will give feedback, comment and ask questions. Draft Discussion Papers will be circulated latest seven days before the calls.
 - The drafting teams will edit their papers based on the feedback. Friday **25.10.** is the deadline for final versions of the Discussion Papers.
 - There is no official page limit, length is under the Sub-groups' consideration. 14 pages is the recommended maximum, the shorter the better.
6. Sub-groups are in the final stages of drafting:
- **Environmental Sustainability and the Generative AI value chain.** The Sub-group is confident their final draft Discussion paper will be ready in time. Suggestions on case studies on generative AI and environment (especially from Latin America, Caribbean) are still welcome. The team will share a consolidated draft for feedback and inputs on 12.9.
 - **AI governance, Interoperability, and Good practices.** Review of existing policy work is mostly finished; current focus is analysing interoperability of AI regulatory frameworks. Input and feedback are needed especially on ethical interoperability and technical interoperability. There is 40+ pages of text, the Sub-group was encouraged to start shortening and editing the material now.
 - **Liability as a mechanism for ensuring AI accountability.** The Sub-group has many new contributors since the last update. Still new, especially legal, expertise is welcome. The Discussion Paper will highlight the need for AI liability conversation and identify key principles where more discussion and consensus is needed. Including liability as one of the key policy levers in the UNESCO Consultation paper is appreciated.
 - **Labour issues within AI's life cycle.** The Sub-group has held regular calls in the past weeks and made progress. Team leaders were not present in the meeting to give update and are encouraged to share any requests for support through PNAI mailing list.

7. Facilitators thanked UNESCO for the presentation and dialogue.
8. PNAI Sub-group leaders and members were thanked for the good progress and leading the discussions so far. Team leaders are encouraged to contact PNAI Facilitators and the community through PNAI mailing list for any support needed in the final drafting weeks.
