Crystallize what we think PNAI should be in the future → Provide a clear vision → Give first few concrete steps towards it

- ” PNAI should strive to be number one in facilitating inclusive, international and bottom-up multistakeholder dialogue on AI Governance.
- ” PNAI should be **unique and not duplicate the type of work of other organizations** or try to be everything at once.
- ” PNAI could have **the widest and deepest intelligence worldwide on AI topics**. PNAI can gather views on any rising AI topic fast and in an agile way. We should make use of this and communicate this strength to increase credibility of reports.
- ” PNAI should focus on work and **reports that connect local insight and global level decisions on AI**
- ” PNAI could be faster, more execution-focused, move from recommendations to more pilots, and become a **sandbox for governance**.
- ” PNAI could be more structured in its knowledge, create repositories and living databases.
- ” PNAI should be institutionalized as IGF AI policy track that is a **continuous, permanent, year-round thematic process** that collects community input, maps initiatives, and develops policy recommendations.

” PNAI should become **permanent trusted sounding board to all major AI governance debates and decisions on international level.**

” We could **offer a space to test and discuss early ideas** before they are turned into international decisions and rules.

” PNAI should not only be follower and support the work on the most widespread “hot” AI topics. It should **also raise new issues and bring important AI topics to the attention of global AI dialogue.**

” PNAI should **not be yet another advisory group but have a compelling value proposition** to the high-level fora.

” PNAI could serve as a platform for capacity building, awareness raising, best practice sharing, for everyone. With special effort in involving emerging economies and marginalized voices.
