**SUMMARY REPORT**

1. The fifth virtual meeting in 2025 of the Policy Network on Artificial Intelligence (PNAI) Multistakeholder Working Group (MWG) took place online on 2 September 2025 at 14:00 UTC.
2. The meeting was hosted by the three MAG facilitators of the PNAI, Amrita Choudhury, Audace Niyonkuru, Xiao Zhang, and coordinator Maikki Sipinen. The final version of the Agenda is attached to this document as Annex A1 and a list of meeting participants as Annex A2. The list of shared documents is annexed as A3.
3. The hosts opened the meeting. The first item on the meeting agenda was an update on latest developments. The main goal of the meeting was to discuss first two themes in preparation for the 2025 PNAI Policy Brief report. The aim is to crystallize a clear vision for PNAI's future and propose first few concrete steps towards realizing it.
4. Starting point texts corresponding to the two topics 'Main activities and role of PNAI, ways PNAI develops recommendations and insight' and 'The value PNAI brings to international AI fora and high-level AI governance dialogues' had been prepared based on input gathered between May and August and circulated through PNAI mailing list two weeks prior to the meeting.
5. The hosts stressed that the report will be compiled based on the discussions in PNAI MWG meetings, and all suggestions on the content are welcome. A lively discussion followed. Meeting attendees brought up for example setting focal points for key AI governance processes, providing practical examples to showcase value of multistakeholder cooperation, securing more permanent PNAI structure and noted that the vision in the Policy Brief should be realistic but ambitious.
6. The second set of Policy Brief topics will be discussed in the next PNAI MWG meeting: '*Connecting to local AI realities, lifting underrepresented voices especially in the Global South*' and '*PNAI as central coordinator hub on AI within the IGF*'.
