Dynamic Coalition Coordination Group (DCCG)

Virtual Meeting #84 | 14 May 2024

Summary Report

I. Adoption of the agenda

The agenda of the DCCG meeting #84 was adopted as proposed and is available in Annex I. The call was moderated by the DCCG co-facilitator Markus Kummer. The list of participants is attached as Annex II.

II. Updates from the Secretariat

Key points raised:

- All participants were informed about the [Second Open Consultations and MAG Meeting](#) taking place from 26 to 28 June 2024 in Geneva, Switzerland, with the Open Consultations day scheduled on 26 June. The [registration platform](#) is open.
- Besides sharing a booth with the IGF 2024 Host Country, the IGF secretariat is organizing two events at the [WSIS Forum High-Level event](#), on 28 May from 16:15 to 17:00 and on Thursday, 30 May from 10:00 to 10:45, respectively, in Geneva:

- The Call for Session Proposals ended on 5 May with over 470 IGF 2024 proposals received:
 - 217 Workshop proposals
 - 72 Open Forums
 - 29 Day 0 events
 - 75 lightning talks
 - 28 networking sessions
 - 29 Launches & Awards
 - 23 Dynamic Coalition sessions
- The IGF Secretariat hired the consultants for the IGF Policy Networks on Internet Fragmentation and on Meaning Access, as well as for the IGF Best Practice Forum on Cybersecurity

III. Introduction of two new DCs

Key points raised:

- The Secretariat announced the launch of two new Dynamic Coalitions, which makes a total of 32 currently active IGF DCs.

Interested readers can also consult the 2023 [report](#) that has been released by the Interplanetary Networking Special Interest Group (IPNSIG), laying out recommendations on governance of how the Interplanetary Internet ecosystem can be realized.
 - The [DC on Financial Digital Inclusion](#) aims to bridge the gap between technological advancements in finance and the segments of society still alienated from these developments, for inclusive economic participation and growth.

Next steps

- DC members are welcome to join and/or promote the new DCs within their networks.

IV. Dynamic Coalition Branding and Specifier

Key points raised:

- DC members were informed about the [DC Branding and Specifier](#), which provides guidance on the role of Dynamic Coalitions and their relationship to the IGF process, as well as guidelines on the use of the IGF logo.
- In case of need and upon request, DCs can reach out to the IGF Secretariat to receive the IGF logo and color code. The IGF Secretariat can be consulted in case of doubt regarding the use of the logo by Dynamic Coalitions.
- The UN name and emblem cannot be used by DCs, as it is limited to official purposes.
- The IGF Secretariat is also working on an IGF branding manual, which will provide templates for DC publications or promotional material.

Next steps

- The IGF Secretariat will post the DC Branding and Specifier on the DC webpage and send an email to the DCs.
- DC coordinators will be asked to share the DC Branding and Specifier with their respective Dynamic Coalitions.

V. IGF 2024 DC session submissions

Key points raised:

- The IGF Secretariat received a total of 23 DC session proposals.
- As a response to the stock taking from the IGF 2023, the IGF 2024 will have a more focused agenda with less sessions on its schedule. DC members were informed that the MAG, which is responsible for the IGF 2024 programme, will have an overview of all the sessions (that are different from workshops) and decide on the number of proposals that can be allocated on the programme.
- Taking into consideration that the MAG may not grant slots to all Dynamic Coalition session proposals, the IGF Secretariat conducted in the past a survey amongst members, which indicated that DCs would prefer to collaborate with other Dynamic Coalitions on joint DC session proposals. In case the MAG limits the number of DC sessions on the programme, the IGF Secretariat would revert to organizers and ask for mergers.
- MAG members, who are currently reviewing all IGF workshop proposals and selecting a final list at the upcoming 2nd Open Consultations and MAG meeting, scheduled from 26 to 28 June, will receive in parallel the lists of all other IGF session proposals received (Dynamic Coalition sessions, Lightning Talks, Launch & Awards, Networking Sessions...).
- Dynamic Coalitions, who did not apply for a DC session but still require a room to meet, can reach out to the IGF Secretariat, which will book a hybrid meeting room for the time of the meeting. This meeting will not appear on the IGF programme.
- For those DCs requesting a meeting room and in need of captioning and/or other accessibility services such as full audio support, can also indicate it in their request to the Secretariat. The IGF Support Association is funding the captioning of DCCG meetings and

could also be asked to consider supporting individual DCs in need of captioning, in case the IGF 2024 host country cannot secure these additional requests.

VI. Any other business

Key points raised:

- The MAG Chair informed MAG members at the virtual MAG meeting back in April about DC's interest in organizing again an intersessional event during the Open Consultations (OC) Day on 26 June. The MAG will soon receive and review the draft agenda for the 2nd OC and MAG meeting, which proposes a 1,5-hour slot to the intersessional event. Once the MAG agrees to the agenda, DCs can start preparing for the event.
- The IGF Secretariat drafted a concept note, which will be shared as soon as the MAG finds consensus on the draft 2nd OC and MAG meeting agenda, to further define the event.
- Amongst other, the event will showcase:
 - The work of Dynamic Coalitions and its value, as well as DCs relationship to other IGF intersessional work streams.
 - How Dynamic Coalitions can provide input into the broader IGF ecosystem and the IGF 2024 programme to strengthen the delivery of outcomes respective to the themes of the IGF.
- The intersessional event will also be an opportunity for the MAG to see the value of DC's work and to avoid pushing DCs to the margins.
- The MAG will receive an output document emerging from the intersessional event, as a reference tool for MAG members when preparing the main sessions.

Next steps

- **The IGF Secretariat will inform DCs as soon as the MAG agrees on a draft agenda for the 2nd OC and MAG meeting.**
- **In case the MAG keeps the slot for the intersessional event, the IGF Secretariat will share with DCs the draft concept note for their comments and views.**

VII. Any other business

Key points raised:

- The IGF Secretariat will send out a Doodle Poll to schedule the next DCCG meeting in June, prior to the 2nd Open Consultations and MAG meeting.
