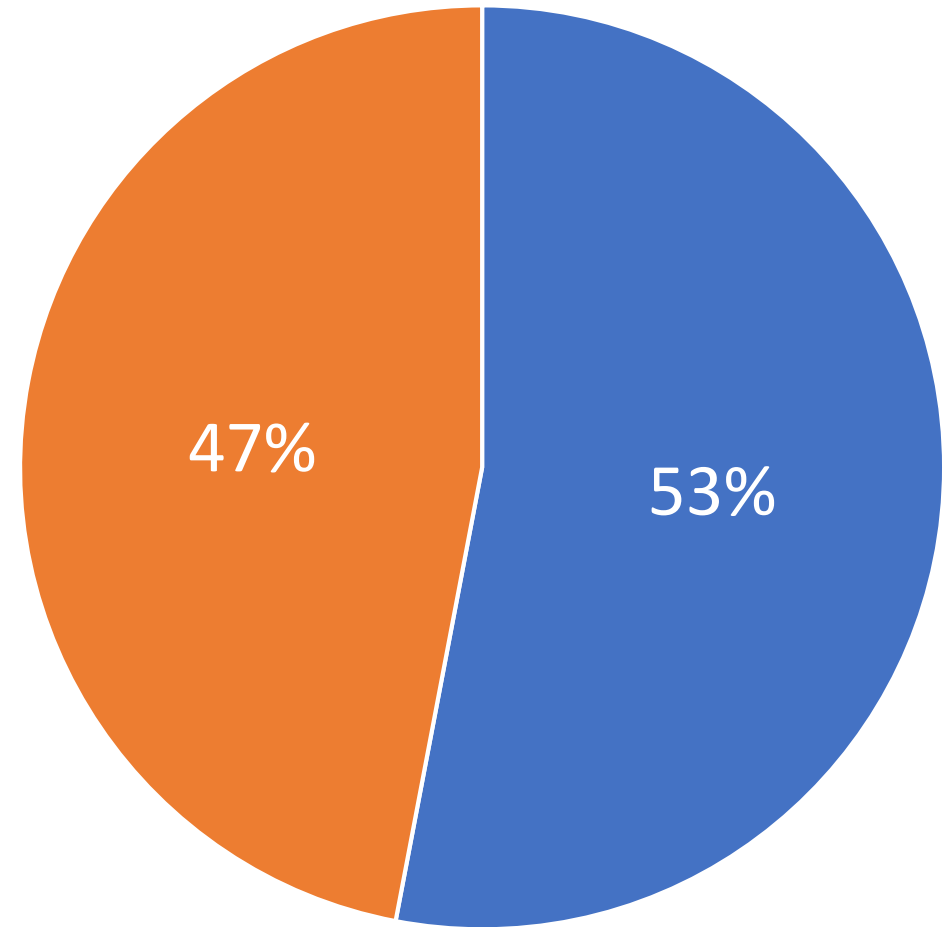


# Internet Governance Forum 2016:

A summary of the Gender Report Cards

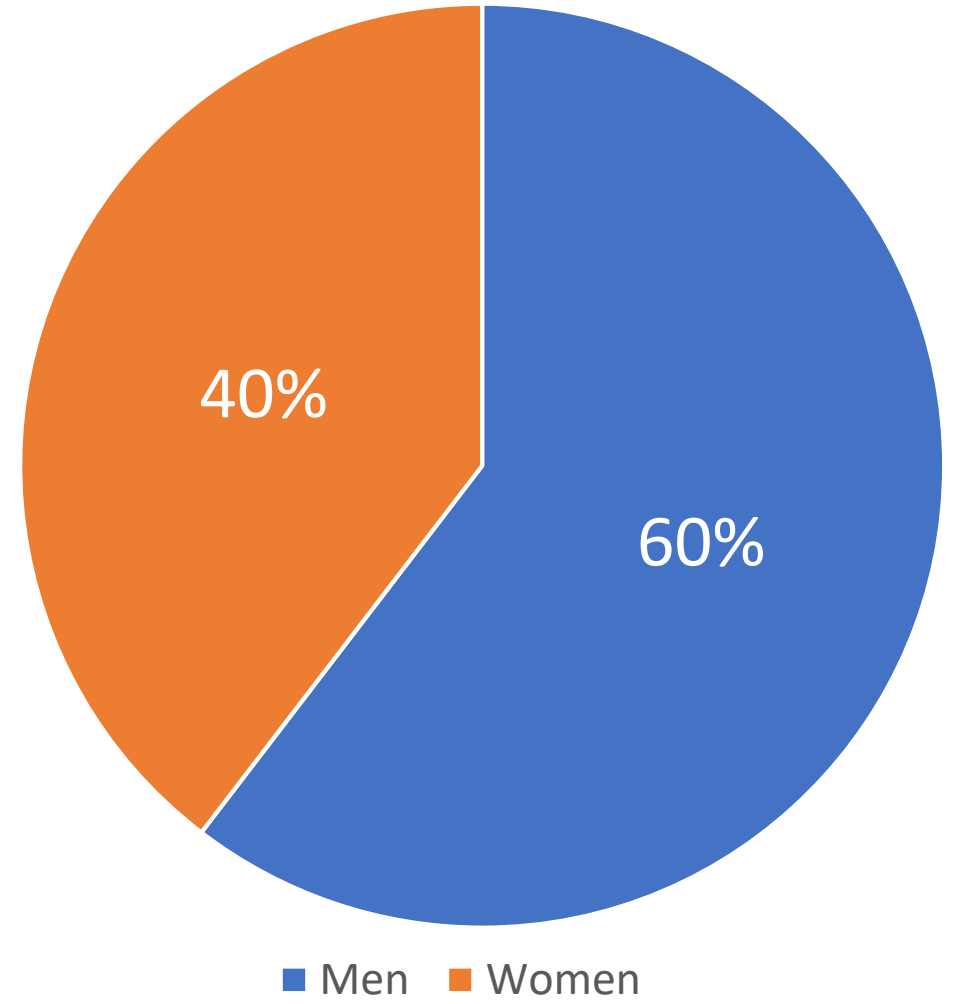
## IGF workshop reports



- Gender report cards were completed for 97 workshops out of 205.

■ Non-reporting workshops    ■ Reporting workshops

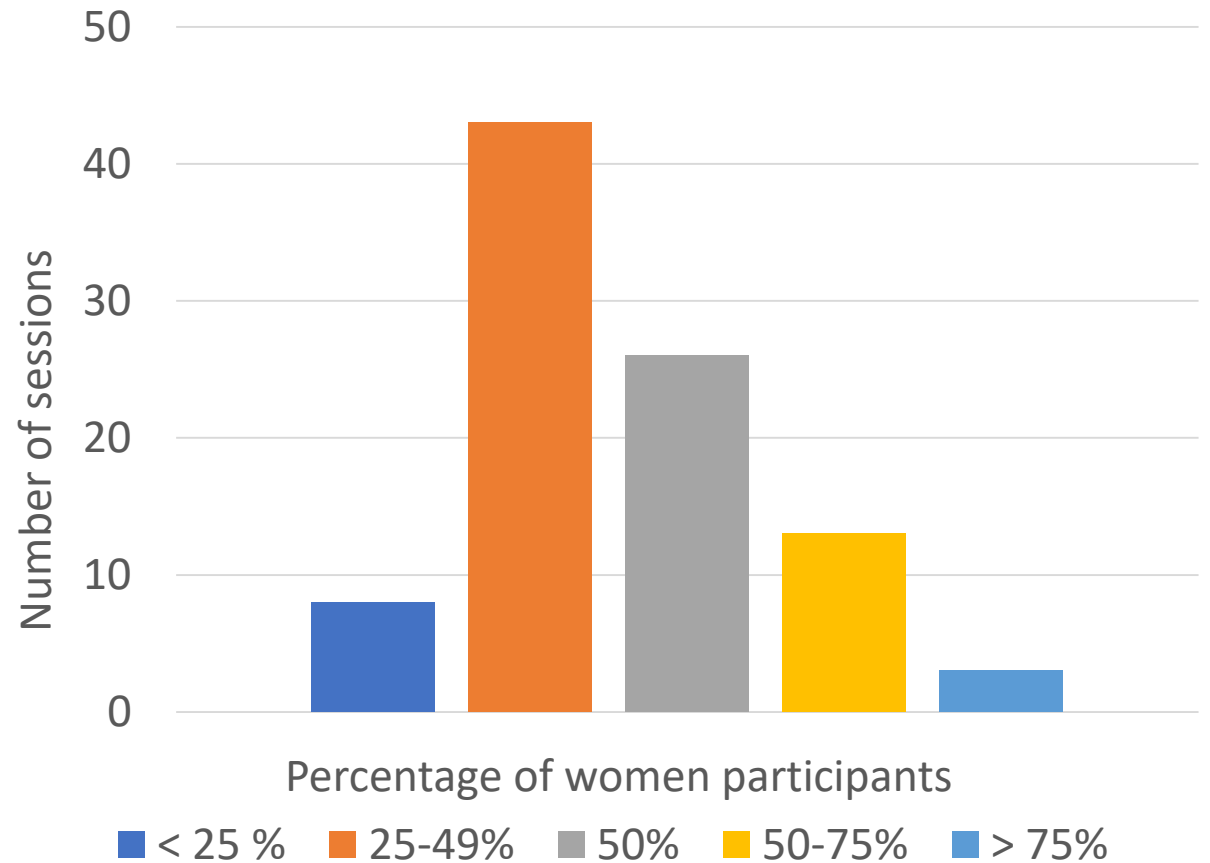
Gender of onsite and online participants



- Almost 40% of the onsite and online participants were women

# Gender Diversity of Participants

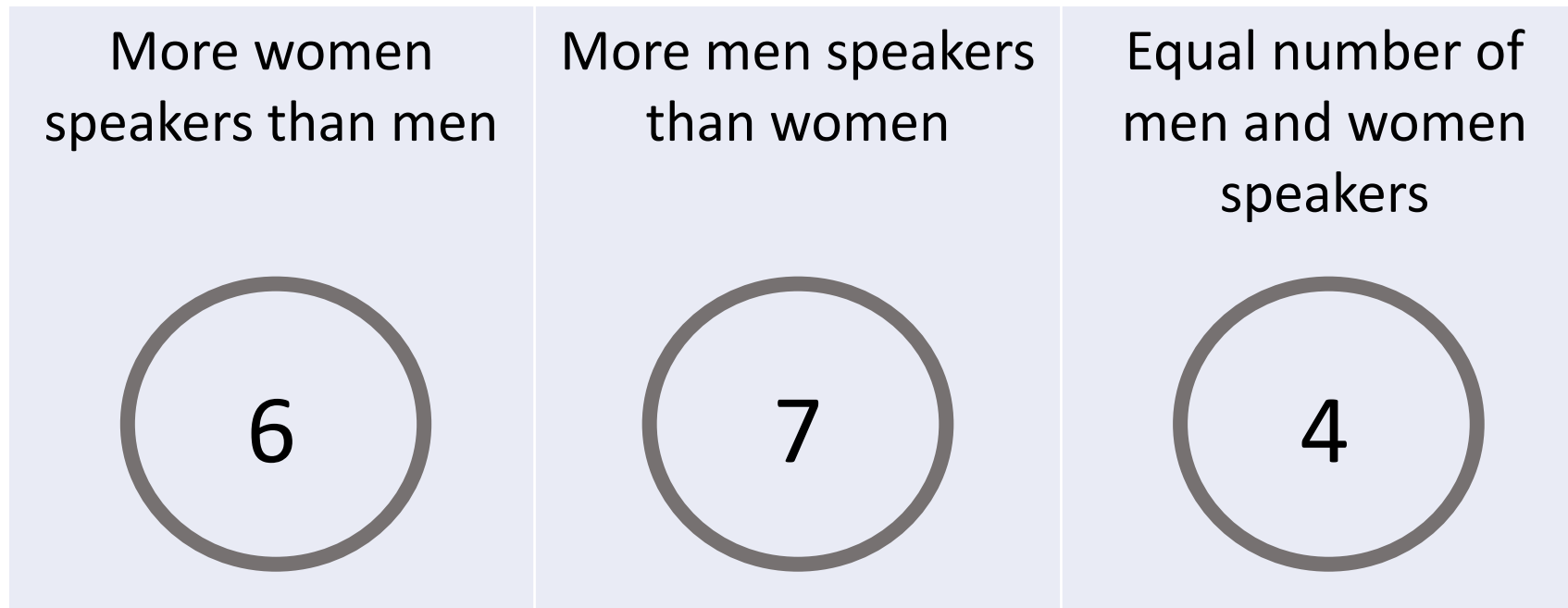
- Number of female participants recorded for 93 sessions/workshops.



# Workshops with majority female participation:

- Dynamic coalition on gender and internet governance
- Is personal data mine or there to be mined?
- Sex and freedom of expression online
- Doxing women: privacy protections against gender violence
- Solutions for countering online abuse against women

# Number of workshop panels with:



Data recorded for 29 workshops, out of which data from 12 reports was inconclusive.

## Sessions with all-women panels:

- Sex and freedom of expression online
- Dynamic coalition on gender and internet governance
- Doxing women: privacy protections against gender violence

# Gender diversity of moderators

- Recorded for only 8 workshops.
- Sex and Freedom of Expression Online workshop had all-women moderators.

# Comparison of gender diversity at IGF

Women as	IGF 2015	IGF 2016
Panelists	37%	Inconclusive
Moderators	35%	Inconclusive
Participants	38%	40%

# Comparison of reporting at IGF

Categories	No. of workshop reports from IGF 2015	No. of workshop reports from IGF 2016
Panelists	105	29
Moderators	105	8
Participants	87	93
