The panellists agreed that there needs to be more coordinating work to make sure that the media sector engages in internet governance debates. This is crucial because even in an age when we have access to some much news and information at our fingertips, people in many societies are not able to access high-quality, independent news content. Sometimes this has to do with government censorship, while at other times it is the result of the policies of corporate policies that put profit over news circulation. The only way to address these issues is to have journalists and media reform advocates get more involved in internet governance.
