

Dynamic Coalition on Platform Responsibility (DCPR)

2025 Annual Report

1. Background Information

The Dynamic Coalition on Platform Responsibility (DCPR) operates within the framework of the Internet Governance Forum (IGF), a multistakeholder platform convened by the United Nations. The Coalition brings together stakeholders from governments, the private sector, civil society, the technical community, and academia to advance dialogue and cooperation on issues related to platform governance and content moderation.

Since its establishment in 2014, the DCPR has promoted principles of transparency, accountability, and human rights protection in platform governance. The Coalition emphasizes the importance of balancing content moderation with freedom of expression, addressing online harms while safeguarding fundamental rights, and ensuring that platform governance mechanisms are inclusive, rights-respecting, and democratically accountable. Its work contributes to ensuring that digital platforms operate in ways that protect users' rights and promote a safe, open, and accessible Internet.

2. Activities Conducted in the Past Year

a. Activities within the IGF

The DCPR members have been contributing to IGF DCCG meetings and discussions addressing platform governance, artificial intelligence, and content moderation.

b. Outputs Produced and Research Conducted

During the reporting period, the DCPR advanced its work on several research and policy initiatives:

- Policy Brief on AI-Generated NCII: The Coalition published a policy brief examining the proliferation of "nudify" applications and AI-generated non-consensual intimate imagery in Brazil, including Google Trends analysis and policy recommendations for search engine deindexing and regulatory coordination.

- Contribution to Meta Oversight Board: The DCPR submitted a public comment to the Meta Oversight Board (Case 2026-021-IG-RA) addressing platform policies on AI-generated sexualized content.
- Academic Publications: Coalition members contributed to high-impact factor journals with peer-reviewed research on platform governance frameworks, including the article "Integridade da informação e responsabilidade de provedores em relação à propaganda digital" (Revista Direito GV, August 2026).

c. Activities Outside the IGF

The DCPR engaged in collaborative activities with academic institutions, civil society organizations, and regulatory bodies to advance dialogue on platform responsibility. In

- The Coalition organized a roundtable on "Online Violence Against Women, Queer, and BIPOC People in Politics" at RightsCon Taipei (February 2025), in partnership with the University of Virginia's Digital Technology for Democracy Lab.
- During RightsCon, the Coalition members also participated in meetings with the OSCE and UNESCO to discuss information integrity and platform governance.

3. Updates on Internal Processes

No significant updates to internal processes were reported during the current reporting period.

4. Priorities and Objectives for the Following Year (2026)

In 2026, the DCPR intends to further examine the implications of generative AI for platform responsibility and content moderation. In particular, the Coalition will focus on:

- Assessing AI-driven content moderation systems: Analyzing the deployment of automated content moderation tools and their impact on freedom of expression, due process, and non-discrimination;
- Addressing AI-generated harms: Examining platform responses to AI-generated non-consensual intimate imagery, deepfakes, and synthetic media, with attention to gender-based violence and vulnerable populations;
- Evaluating platform transparency and accountability mechanisms: Analyzing the effectiveness of content moderation appeals systems, transparency reporting, and

independent oversight bodies (including oversight boards and regulatory authorities);

- Incorporating perspectives from the Global South: Ensuring that Coalition research and policy recommendations reflect the experiences, priorities, and regulatory contexts of stakeholders in Latin America, Africa, and Asia;
- Strengthening multistakeholder dialogue: Facilitating ongoing engagement between civil society, platforms, governments, and technical experts to develop inclusive and contextually relevant policy frameworks.

Through this work, the DCPR aims to contribute to informed multistakeholder dialogue on emerging challenges and to support the continued development of policies that uphold human rights, democratic values, and a safe, open, and inclusive Internet.
