Main messages	- The Marrakesh Visually Impaired Persons Treaty (2013) together with other initiatives such as the Accessible Books Consortium (ABC) can have a tremendous impact in the production and distribution via the Internet of accessible books worldwide.
	 The book famine and the lack of access to information is directly linked to the low rate of employment of people with disabilities.
	- The book famine is only partially caused by legal issues; technological and economic factors including access to the Internet are often the major barriers.
	- The network of libraries around the globe could play a key role in enabling customized and targeted access to people with disabilities.
	- Enabling access for people with disabilities other than visual impairment, presents specific challenges that need to be addressed in parallel.
