Network Shutdowns: Deji Olukotun Senior Global Advocacy Manager at AccessNow, presented the FOC with a petition carrying nearly 50,000 signatures from 148 different countries calling on world leaders to end government-sponsored, intentional disruptions of Internet and mobile services as part of the #KeepItOn campaign. The campaign documented at least 51 shutdowns in the first 11 months of 2016, and asked the FOC member governments to work together to counter this troubling trend. Justin Keyes, U.S. Department of State, noted that the FOC committed in October 2016 to issuing a Joint Statement on Network Shutdowns, with the Governments of Ghana and the United States leading the drafting process for the FOC with input from external stakeholders.
